Hilton by Tain Jany 7th 1864

Dear Sir,

I am sorry to find that their [sic] are some misunderstanding between us about the trees that were given out of the reserved belt at Rhuniscarrow Wood, I took it to be 200 Trees which was shown marked to me by Hugh Shannon. Since then I find that there are 50 of them kept off after them being marked, I got the 200 valued, and I would never think of giving the money for the lot without the 200 trees, it will do nothing but clear itself, but by keeping 50 trees off, it will be a loss to me. Therefore unless I get the 200 trees I rather not to cut any of the wood, as I know you would not like to have all my labour in manufacturing that wood for nothing.

I am sorry to put you to so much trouble.
